## Local Risk Assessment

Risks	Impact on community	What can the Community Emergency Group do to prepare?
Flooding	Flooding of local streets  Damage to property and displacement of residents	Encourage residents to improve home flood defences Work with local emergency responders to see if they can help with distribution of flood warnings Establish known evacuation and rest centres Find out what flood defences exist or are planned in the area Identify in advance a source of sandbags
High winds	Fallen trees that could block roads Damage to homes and other buildings	Tree wardens to keep an eye out for trees at risk from falling in winds
Snow and ice	Residents unable to enter or leave village if multiple roads not passable. Problems for emergency vehicle access	Ensure communication channels established and known (e.g. Village Facebook page). Grit bins available at most problematic locations
Railway crossing incident	Limited routes to access and exit village	Ensure communication channels established and known (e.g. Village Facebook page).
Power outage	Lack of heat/lighting; Medical equipment?	Emergency generators availability
Fire	Residential property or community building	Ensure fire alarms are promoted and all community buildings have necessary fire warning and safety measures

## Activating this plan

If there is no immediate threat to life but you have information likely to help the Emergency Services please dial 101. The information in this Plan is designed to be used by any local resident whenever needed.

The Plan may also be activated by one of the responding agencies e.g.; the Local Council or the Emergency Services.

## **First steps in an emergency**

1. Call 999 (unless already alerted)
2. Ensure you are in no immediate danger
3. Contact the Community Emergency Group and meet to discuss the situation
4. Check on vulnerable members of your community
5. Report back to plan co-ordinator
6. Liaise with Local Authority Emergency Planner if assistance required (i.e. help from voluntary sector such as 4x4 Response)
