1. Apologies for Absence

It was RESOLVED:

to accept the apologies for absence.

2. Declarations of Interest in Matters on the Agenda and Dispensation Requests

4. Minutes of the Meeting held on 3 March 2025

It was **RESOLVED**:

To approve the minutes of the meeting as drafted.

Cllr C Cheeseman proposed to remove Item 6 from the agenda as recent incoming correspondence had not been reviewed by all councillors. It was felt that the Parish Council needed more information from the School as to what the role involved before the Parish Council considered this request. This was agreed by all.

It was **RESOLVED**:

 to remove Item 6 from the Agenda and for the Clerk to write to the school for more information

5. Updates from Clerk and Councillors

5.1 Sinks Pit Community Liaison Group

Cllr I Ransome attended the meeting and reported that East Suffolk Council Environment Protection were re-evaluating the original noise abatement notice and whether a second investigation is required due to complaints arising from the west of the site.

The Work of the Sinks Pit Community Liaison Group is coming to an end and ESC EP would like complaints to be handled as 'business as usual'. However, not all complaints are received directly to TRU for immediate investigation. Cllr I Ransome suggested that a separate entry into the Fynn Lark News would remind all local residents on how to report complaints and that this would possibly be a joint LBPC/TRU entry. It would also be useful if ESC EP contributed to this entry.

5.2 Sizewell C Transport Forum

Cllr I Ransome raised questions about the level crossing in Little Bealings that is due to be closed during November, December 25 and January 26 and how this will impact the Village. Included in the Sizewell rail project there is an option to build an acoustic barrier along the line behind properties in Martlesham Road and Beacon Lane. The Parish Council were not informed of the original planning application for this and were not invited to comment.

The Sizewell C Project does not include work on the Little Bealings level crossing or track. Network rail has not said what works they intend to do during the closure. Cllr I Ransome will attend the next meeting.

5.3 Deben Climate Centre

Cllr I Ransome spoke with a representative at the Deben Climate Centre who test the water quality in the rivers Fynn and Lark and their latest report has been circulated. He asked if the Parish Council were interested in getting involved? Cllr C Cheeseman said that he believes that the water quality varies depending on how much rainfall there had been. The Parish Council did not feel a presentation was required.

5.4 Devolution

There is now lots of information coming through to the Parish Council about Devolution. Cllr I Ransome said that SALC are due to publish some more user-friendly information that could be used on the Parish Council website and that they are going to send out a questionnaire.

It was **RESOLVED**:

 That Cllr I Ransome and the Clerk would fill out the questionnaire on behalf of the Parish Council

5.5 Clerk's Forum

The Clerk reported that the Parish Council will be liable to Employers National insurance from the start of the new financial year. She is due to start her CILCA course on 16 April.

The Parish Council had not been consulted on this application. A new access road has been built to the site, however the Parish Council has been unable to ascertain who is using the site and for what purpose?
